Wilburn also has performed as a vocalist in the U.S. and at international venues, including Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris.

He received his bachelor's degree in humanities from LeMoyne-Owen College. As mayor of Sunset, Ark., Wilburn established a Sunset Sister City cultural exchange program with Malika, Senegal and West Africa; was appointed to the Arkansas State Parks Committee by then-Governor Bill Clinton. President Clinton also appointed Wilburn to the Lower Mississippi Delta Development Committee.

Wilburn is a NAACP Image Award recipient. His wife, Roberta, is director of graduate studies at Whitworth University.
